Shalom House



Shalom is the name given to a house that was moved to Titoki in 1978 and has been used for accommodation. One dream has been to make it available to missionaries needing somewhere to stay during times of transition or on home leave. Well with the financial support of the Mary Atkin Trust that is now a reality. Titoki and the Mary Atkin Trust have a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) which has allowed Shalom to be renovated and since the beginning of January there has been a steady flow of missionary folk staying, some for a few nights and others are booked for 2 months. The MOU means missionaries

can stay free but are independent to Titoki in that they supply their own food and transport. Titoki did have to pay to complete the renovation and there are chattels and whiteware needed to fully fit it out, so there is opportunity for donations to help. The feedback from folk staying at Shalom has been very positive and the demand has been steady without much advertising. We've had missionaries who have served in Tanzania, Afghanistan, Birmingham and Senegal. Let's pray that the house will indeed be a place of shalom: wholeness and peace. **For bookings contact Titoki.**

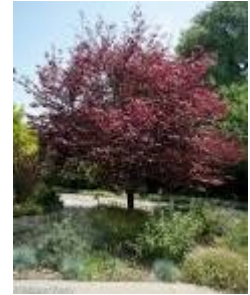
